Word From Pastor Steve

(Note: This article arose out of a recent wedding I performed.)

"LOVE and MARRIAGE"

Our society talks a lot about love in poems, songs, and sayings, but so much of it isn't always all that accurate or helpful. Love at its best and highest comes from God, because love is central and foundational to the very nature of God. And in the Bible, God spells out clearly what true love is. For example, check out 1 Corinthians 13:4-8 as expressed in the Living Bible paraphrase:

"Love is very patient and kind, never jealous or envious, never boastful or proud, never haughty or selfish or rude. Love does not demand its own way. It is not irritable or touchy. It does not hold grudges and will hardly even notice when others do it wrong. It is never glad about injustice, but rejoices whenever truth wins out. If you love someone you will loyal to him or her no matter what the cost. You will always believe in him or her, always expect the best of him or her, and always stand your ground in defending him or her. All the special gifts and powers from God will someday come to an end, but love goes on forever."

This is **true love**. It is **God's love**. And it can be our level of love, **if** we ask Jesus to bring God's love into our hearts. Then we can experience true love and live by it.

A man and woman's affection for each other leads them to the point of marriage. Marriage is the committing of themselves totally to each other in order to experience the full measures of love for the rest of their lives. That being the case, I want to emphasize four components of true love that I consider absolutely essential in order for a couple to experience the very best in their life together.

1. True love is **unconditional**.

Conditional love puts qualifiers on its expression. Conditional love says, "I will love you **if**, you always make me happy," or "I will love you **if** you never hurt me or disappoint me," or "I will love you **if** you never burn my steak!"

Unconditional love, on the other hand, says, "I love you, period! I love you, warts and defects and all! I love you with a love that will help both of us grow and improve."

God's love for us is unconditional. He doesn't ask us to change before He will love us. He loves us from the very beginning. And as we seek to love Him back, we are transformed for the better. As **1 John 4:19** says, "We love because He first loved us."

Recently I read about a bride who was nearing the end of her wedding preparations and who made a list of three areas that still needed her attention: "aisle, altar, hymn." Her minister happened to notice her list, but based on some of her remarks during their premarital counseling sessions, he saw a different message there. He saw, "I'll, alter, him!" It's not wise to go into a marriage with a list of changes that **must** be made in your spouse right away in order for you to be satisfied with him or her. That attitude in a marriage can lead to frustration, division, and separation. Make sure your love is unconditional...

2. True love is forgiving.

There is a popular saying out there that comes from a movie produced several years ago called "Love Story". The saying goes like this: "Love means you never have to say you're sorry." The problem with it, is that it is simply not true! True love is always ready to say, "I was wrong. I'm sorry. Please forgive me." And it also says, "I accept your apology. I forgive you." It's an imperfect world.

We are imperfect people. We all fail each other from time to time. There is no other way to stay in love and harmony **except** to willingly admit our failures and say that we're sorry.

Regarding our relationship with the Lord, the Bible says in **1 John 1:9,** "If we confess our sins, He (Jesus) is faithful and just and will forgive our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." So in that same spirit, readily forgive each other. Seek to resolve conflicts quickly. As **Ephesians 4:26-27** says, "Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, and do not give the devil a foothold."

3. True love is sacrificial.

Sacrificial love puts the needs and desires of others above its own needs and desires. As **Philippians 2:4-5,8** says, "Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others. Your **attitude** should be the same as that of Christ Jesus......He humbled himself and became obedient to death..." Again, Jesus (God) sets the example. Jesus didn't assert His rights as God. Instead, He put our need for a Savior ahead of His own desires, (and rights!!), and willingly died on a cross in our place. Jesus sacrificed Himself so that we could be **forgiven** and **restored** to fellowship with God. "But God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." **(Romans 5:8)**

But what does it mean to forgive? It means to set the other person free from the consequences of their failures by absorbing the pain of their failures into yourself. This is called sacrificial love. It's the love Jesus has for us. It's the love He displayed on the cross. And it's the love He wants us to have for each other, especially in marriage.

4. True love is founded upon a bedrock of **commitment**.

There is another common, misleading idea floating around out there that is also **not true**. It is this notion that, "love will keep your marriage alive." This statement reveals a total misconception of marriage. It is asserting that feelings/ emotion will keep your marriage strong and alive. Actually, it is the opposite that is true. From the day of your wedding forward, it is your **marriage**, that is, your **commitment**, your **vows**, your **promises**, your **willingness** to stay **faithful**, to be **forgiving**, to **sacrifice yourself**..., it is all those things that will keep your **love** strong and alive!!

And my friends, this right here!, is why marriage is so very, very important and essential! It is a given, that temptations and distractions and troubles and challenges will come against your marriage. There will be turbulent, difficult, dark tunnels that you and your spouse will have to go through. It is your marriage vows and promises, it is your COMMITMENT to each other, that will get you through the dark tunnels and out into the light at the end.

Mere emotion and feelings will NOT get you there!

So for the **best** in **love** and **marriage** and **life**, let **God**, who embodies true love, **have His way** in your **hearts**, and He will help you **grow** your love into something very special. And then, not only will you **rejoice**, but all those around you, who care about you and are influenced by you, will **rejoice** as well!

(Dear friends, I'm sure that you are aware that God's idea of marriage is under attack in our society. It is being ridiculed, mocked, and rejected far and wide. It is being downplayed as "old fashioned" and "just a piece of paper." Or it is being entirely redefined. But as you can see from what I have just written, it is sacred and wise and far more than just a piece of paper. It is essential to God's plan for the human race. I have felt compelled by God to write down this message. It has taken many hours to complete it. children from age one up praying over their food, I am reminded of what Jesus said to the disciples "Suffer little children to come unto me" and realize we here at Morris are fulfilling the Word of God. Thank you, church family for allowing so great a ministry to exist in the Kanawha Valley.

So many have asked how is the center doing and I can only say we are doing very well and stay full and have a waiting list that is long. We in the past few weeks have had graduation for Pre-K and celebrated Mother's Day and Father's Day making gifts to honor our parents and if you come by you will see at least one group painting or blowing bubbles for the parents love art work. Soon these children will head back to school and it will be quiet around here.

Summer is here and the sound of laughter can be heard from children who feel secure and loved. The weather has been hot and balmy but we have found a way to keep cool, because we are too young to go swimming, so we have water sprayed on us or we sit around after a hard day's play eating popsicles. We invite you to stop by for a cup of coffee, a cookie or two and we gladly share our popsicles.
