COMMON GROUNDS NEWS AND NEEDS

In our last article we shared that we were preparing for our Thanksgiving food boxes. Two days before Thanksgiving we gave out 221 boxes filled with the makings of a complete Thanksgiving dinner for each of those families (who signed up in October). The Sunday before that our Youth Group came to Common Grounds to help put those boxes together and what a help they were! We were grateful for the help and we trust it was a good experience for those young people in doing for others less fortunate than they.

On Sunday, Nov. 17 we held our Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service at Village Chapel Presbyterian Church, one of our sponsoring churches. What a joy we all experienced worshipping in thanksgiving and unity! It truly was a special time of sharing. Some statistics that were shared at the service (and that may be of interest to you) include: Common Grounds was opened in September, 2007. During that time we have assisted 3,428 families and have provided 27,441 boxes of food. Over that time we have averaged 210 Thanksgiving boxes a year. The average number of families served per day is 20. The average monthly income per household is \$718.49.

It was also reported that we operate with no paid staff and our operating expenses are limited to rent, phone, security fee, utilities, and occasional printing supplies. As with most non-profit organizations, contributions are down and volunteer numbers have decreased. Our volunteers are our most valuable asset. If you do not as yet please consider it. We'd love to have your help!

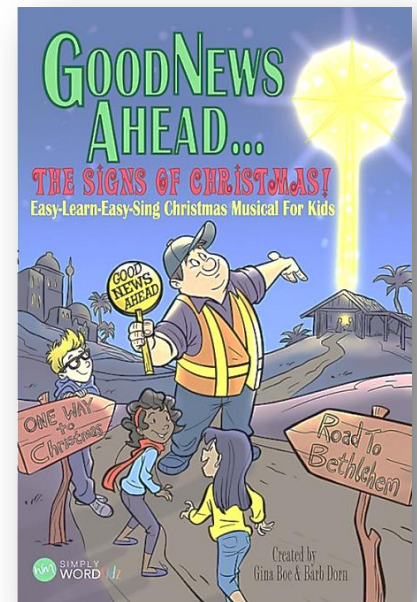

ANGEL TREE

It Starts With A GIFT

Angel Tree is a Prison Fellowship program that serves incarcerated parents by giving them a way to restore and strengthen the relationships with their children and families. Every Christmas, Angel Tree mobilizes local churches and organizations to minister to hundreds of thousands of children by delivering a gift, a personal message of love from their mom or dad in prison, and the Good News of the Gospel.

Here's how it works: Angel Tree coordinators gather information from inmates who want to participate in the program and provide it to local churches and organizations. Volunteers prepare "angel gift tags" to provide the information to those who wish to purchase gifts. Morris Memorial has actively supported this ministry for many years. This year we have been asked to serve **34 local families with a total of 60 children.**

Every child receives **TWO GIFTS**, each of which is valued between \$15 and \$20. One gift is a **FUN** gift (a type of toy, game, etc.) which is suggested by the inmate. The other gift is an item of **CLOTHING** which is suggested by the child's caregiver (type of clothing, size and color preference noted on gift tag). Two Christmas trees with the angel gift tags have been set up in the entryway of the church sanctuary; one tree for the clothing gifts and the other for the fun gifts (pink ribbons for girls and blue ribbons for boys). Participants may choose to purchase a single gift or several if desired.

All gifts are to be wrapped and labeled with the angel gift tag and need to be brought to the church by **DECEMBER 8TH at the latest.** Volunteers will be present in the sanctuary entryway to receive the gifts at both Sunday worship services (at other times the gifts may be given to Erin in the church office). Families will pick up the gifts the following week at which time they are also given the opportunity to request a free, easy to read copy of the Bible.
