What is Discipleship?

Are you a disciple¹ of Jesus Christ? Is it obvious in your walk of faith? Below is Bill Hull's definition of "discipleship" taken from his book *The Complete Book of Discipleship on Being and Making Followers of Christ*; a definition I believe we can use to make a personal judgement of self in our proclamation of being a disciple of Christ.

"Discipleship isn't a program or an event; it's a way of life. It's not for a limited time, but for our whole life. Discipleship isn't for beginners alone; it's for all believers for every day of their life. Discipleship isn't just one of the things the church does; it is what the church does. It's not just part of the advancement of God's kingdom; the existence of serious disciples is the most important evidence of God's work on earth. Without enough workers, the task languishes and the whole work remains incomplete."²

A question we might ask ourselves is how do we get to the point in our lives during our faith journey where we live, breath, and practice discipleship without hesitation? I'm glad you asked! This answer might help:

"Through God's sanctifying grace we grow and mature in our ability to live as Jesus lived. As we pray, study the Scriptures, fast, worship, and share in fellowship with other Christians, we deepen our knowledge of and love for God. As we respond with compassion to human need and work for justice in our communities, we strengthen our capacity to love neighbor. Our inner thoughts and motives, as well as our outer actions and behavior, are aligned with God's will and testify to our union with God." Please take this and chew on it awhile. Only you and God can determine where you are on your discipleship journey.

What is the Morris Enrichment Center (MEC)?

It is a family of people of various ages, backgrounds, faiths, beliefs and lifestyles who come together to grow, encourage, develop, learn, teach, help one another, care for one another, love one another, and strive to show God's love in all they do and say. It is a nurturing environment, a ministry of Morris Memorial United Methodist Church. The youngest is at least six weeks old and the oldest is less than 100 years young. Lives are changed, friendships are formed, and sometimes patience is tested.

We are a blessed community and we share our gifts. We share gifts of food with Common Grounds. We share our blessings of financial grants with the church in providing paper products, cleaning supplies and equipment especially during the pandemic. We installed treads on the stairways so none of us fall. During the last couple of years our blessings have removed worn out carpeting and asbestos flooring, installing new flooring in six rooms of the church. Our cameras help make the church safe. Maintaining the kitchen equipment benefits us all. MEC has also assisted with funding toward repairs to the church building, telephone system, and pre-pandemic provided meals for church members who needed some assistance or were simply in the building for Bible study or a meeting.

Part of taking care of MEC involves becoming responsible to ourselves as well. An investment to make sure we can meet our financial obligations has been established. Currently the board is working to develop a scholarship fund for those who need extra help when life throws a curve. MEC invests in itself by encouraging the staff to take classes, become more educated about the children in our care, and improving themselves.

We have prayed for the church, staff & families when they needed it most. MEC has helped with coping skills in the loss of a parent, family member, or personal problems that may have arrived. It's not just a daycare in the usual sense of the word. It is a living, breathing organism that provides daily care!

We at Common Grounds are always seeking ways to improve. We realize we have the opportunity to try to be change agents....one box of food at a time, one family at a time. You are an important part of that (if you wish). You may have noticed that when we suggest contributions for foods we suggest making healthier food selections, if possible. We realize that's not always possible and that is okay. Please know that we are so grateful for whatever donations you have for us. Genuine thanks for that!

As another year has begun we at Common Grounds reflect upon the blessings of this past year. The word "VOLUNTEERS" comes to mind. Common Grounds is sponsored by three churches and is operated entirely by volunteers. We would be amiss to forget to thank our outstanding volunteers from Morris Memorial! We have volunteers who collect food from our church and any other donating agencies and those who pick up pastries and breads from Panera on Wednesdays to be distributed on Thursdays when our outreach mission is open. We have people who check the expiration dates of incoming food and put them on the shelves readying them for distribution. We have people who make up small, medium, and large boxes of food to "fit" the size of the requesting families. We have people who greet the families, determine their eligibility, register them, and provide the boxes of food for them and/or requested utility help (limited).

We also have volunteers who collect boxes so we can make up boxes of food. We also have volunteers who serve on the Board and those who come to help on special occasions (ex: the day we distribute Thanksgiving boxes of food.) You who so generously share food with Common Grounds are volunteers as you voluntarily bring food for us to distribute to needy neighbors. Even with all these listed volunteers, this list is not exhaustive. Please forgive me if I have inadvertently omitted you; that does not diminish your importance to us. Our volunteers are INVALUABLE as we work together to do the Lord's work.

Speaking of volunteers, in January we are pleased to share that we welcomed three new volunteers from Morris Memorial this past month. What a glorious day! We look forward to enjoying our work together in the Lord's service each week at our outreach mission! What a blessing!
