The Nurture 'N' Action team meets each Monday at 10:00 in the library. We are so blessed to tell you our team provides everything, without using any money from the Church Budget, except the occasional roll of stamps. Luckily those are usually provided by others in the church or team members. We have become closer as brothers and sisters in Christ by working on this very loving mission of our church. Here are our current activities:

- 1. Maintain our prayer list and update as needed. Teddi emails the list each week. If you have a prayer need during the week, let Teddi or a team member know. There is no longer a call-in prayer chain.
- 2. Deliver 24 lunch bags to Charleston General's ICU Waiting Room for families who need food day or night. Monthly before Covid.
- 3. Maintain 6 lunch bags in the church volunteer office. Monthly (as needed) before Covid, but we do watch those closely.
- 4. Bread delivery and welcoming e-mails or cards sent to first time visitors.
- 5. 24 Cards are sent monthly to our shut-ins and others who need "a special personal touch." Sometimes folks just need to know the church cares whatever the circumstances. If someone in the church would like us to send a card to a loved one or friend, please provide us the name and address. We do not confine ourselves to those inside the church. Recently we sent a card to someone outside of the church who shared they had never received a card, and they were so happy. This person framed the card because it was so meaningful.
- 6. Special cards and small gifts are delivered to the shut-ins at Christmas.
- 7. Follow up on members who "go missing" for several Sundays, which may include a card or phone call.
- 8. Cards to others as needed i.e. sympathy, surgery, etc.
- 9. When there is a need that we can address, we do so as a team.
- 10. Bereavement baskets are prepared when there is a death in our church family.

### Common Grounds News and Needs

As with many businesses, Common Grounds has had some challenges due to two plus years of COVID. Interestingly enough, we are not seeing many homeless people nowadays; yet it's a time we're seeing many more homeless on our streets in downtown Charleston. Our actual numbers of people other than the homeless have been fluctuating but are on the rise again, for which we are very thankful. We are so eager to help those in need in our community.

With the jump in the cost of utility bills, we find those services at Common Grounds in greater demand. Whether it be requests for food or for utility assistance, the less fortunate in our community are in need. The utility assistance we provide is limited as we only help a family once a year and then up to \$200.00. We do try to help in a crisis. Persons asking for utility help must meet our criteria of residency in Eastern Kanawha County, have a limited monthly income, and the utility request must be for a termination notice. If they are deemed eligible (and if we still have budgeted utility assistance money remaining for that month) Common Grounds will pledge up to \$200 toward that bill; however, we will not pay that bill until the person has been able to secure pledges (including what they personally can pay toward the entire bill). We will refer them to other agencies which might be able to help them and will wait for them to contact us with the other pledges they've secured. Once the bill is covered, we will pay our pledged part of their bill. Please know that we work at being stewards of what we have been given.

We are probably facing another hurdle with the increase in gas prices. Our families can come from as far away as Montgomery, quite a distance, and therefore a substantial cost for gasoline to get to Common Grounds and back. Time will tell. In addition to our regular food boxes this past month we have also offered our families pancake mix and syrup. Our special of the month has been a dozen eggs and sausage or bacon, their choice. This has been quite popular!

Thanks to all of you who are willing to share what you have with our needy neighbors. Your donations are invaluable, whether they be food, money, volunteer time.....or prayers. Without your help, we could not do this important work for the Lord. This month will you please help us out by bringing CANNED BAKED BEANS, CANNED FRUITS, AND/OR BOXED MACARONI AND CHEESE. We'd be so grateful!

### **Morris Enrichment News**

The Morris Enrichment Center is developing and being blessed in so many ways! And in being blessed they share their gifts and joys with you, the members of Morris Memorial. In the past when things didn't appear bright for MEC, you stepped up and helped them to get on their feet again. Since then, MEC has paid off that gift from you and found ways to help the church in unique ways.

Previously, we've mentioned that all the paper products used here at the church are paid for by MEC. Asbestos, worn-out flooring, and kitchen appliances have been removed, repaired and replaced. Part of the insurance of the building is paid by MEC as well. The playground was improved and fencing was also added for safety.

What's coming? A washer and dryer, new security cameras, and new tables and chairs in the library and an adult classroom are some of the gifts from MEC and the grants they have received. Some of the staff have even contributed skills to repair plumbing at no cost to the church.

Congratulations are due! Michelle Hudnall, a Pre-K assistant teacher, has completed her coursework through the Department of



Labor. This achievement is the equivalent of an Associate Degree in Early Childhood Education. She now is beginning the next step to earning her bachelor's degree. Angela Oldham, a parent representative on the MEC Board, and her family joined the church on Easter Sunday. Her two sons, Nash and Easton, were baptized that day as well.

We had a special graduation for one of our Pre-K students who was going to be out of the country at the May 19<sup>th</sup> ceremony.
